2025 Major Changes

- Add a Late Entry Window with Late Fee for 1 week after the deadline
- Make sure all teachers/leaders have access to showorks to see their exhibitors entries
- No breakdown of tack or pens or cleaning after market week until the auction trucks are off

- Meat Broilers Pen consists of 2 birds- weighing between 3lb and 6.5lbs
- Novice Showmanship- All 1 st and 2 nd place winners of Novice showmanship will advance to their correct age class to compete (if there are heats in their age break they will be added to a heat and must qualify in a heat to make the run off)
- Round Robin will be changed to Master Showmanship
 - o the fair will supply all animals
 - Only first place showmanship winners will advance
 - First place winners must participate in master showmanship
- Add Turkey Showmanship
- Non exhibitors/leaders/advisors/teachers/parents are NOT allowed to assist in the fitting of animals for the California Mid Winter Fair. (Fitting livestock is defined as preparing an animal for the show including, but not limited to, washing, blow drying, clipping, brushing, spraying or trimming) Livestock leaders, advisors and parents may assist with the feeding and watering of animals. For the safety of all exhibitor's and the public, adult may assist exhibitors and their animals to the scale, wash racks, and showrings, but the exhibitor must be present and have a hold/control of the animal.
- Non exhibitors/leaders/advisors/teachers/parents may assist in loading and unloading of trailers and vehicles excluding animals.
- All animals must be completely clipped before arrival at the fair. There will be no clipping allowed on the grounds.
- All shows will be considered a "blow and go" which means there can be no, but not limited to no fitting, no sprays, no adhesives, no baby powder, no colorants and no oils. The only allowed substance on the animal is water. (excluding shampoo and conditioner during the washing process)
- Exhibitors are prohibited from wearing earbuds or any type of electronic listening device while in the show ring
- Pre Registration is REQUIRED-via google doc
- If an exhibitor is disqualified at any local, county, regional, state or national show or fair they will be ineligible to exhibit at the California Mid-Winter Fair for (1) year from the
- disqualification.
- Auction checks will be mailed out starting one month after the fair. Checks will be mailed on a weekly basis from that point forward. An exhibitors cut will not be cut until their buyers pay their bill.
- Auction checks will be sent via United States Postal Service. Any checks returned due to
- incorrect addresses will need to be picked up at the fair office by the exhibitor after notification of the check being returned. Any lost checks will be reissued minus any fees incurred for reissuance.
