Each student is REQUIRED to participate in a minimum of **10 FFA activities** every quarter. Approximately twenty five opportunities are offered each quarter.

For ex: FFA meetings and activities, fundraisers, shirt credits, service projects, virtual conferences & activities. EXTRA CREDIT points will be awarded for each additional activity.

Course Description

The course is designed to acquaint the student with the theories and principles of personal and servant leadership. A focus area of the class is the operation of the FFA and its many activities at all levels. The Chapter Officer Team's goal is to improve and increase the number of local chapter activities, increase participation in CDE's above the class level, assist with ag lab (school farm and greenhouse) improvement and provide the opportunities to develop your personal leadership skills and plan for the future. This is a very important planning period for those who want to assist in the operation of our chapter and department. A Supervised Agricultural Experience Program is required and will be developed or maintained with the assistance of the agricultural instructor. Due to the nature of this class, student time is not limited to only classroom experiences. Students should plan to be involved in a majority of FFA activities, as participation will be graded for each chapter activity.

SAE is a hands on marketable Ag project outside of class. Graded by SAE reports, AET recordbook, and project activities. TRADITIONAL OPTIONS

- Mechanics project (if enrolled in ag shop)
- Ag related employment/placement/school coop project
- Animal Project(breeding or market animals)
- Still exhibits: Ag photography, agriscience fair, ornamental or vegetable plants, food science projects, ropework, leather making, ag related arts, floral designs.

LATE WORK




- ALL assignments will be given a due date and students are provided ample class time, LATE WORK will be
